MERCHANT SHIPPING MINIMUM SAFE MANNING ORDERS, 1990

In exercise of power conferred by section 82 (3) of the Bangladesh Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1983 (XXVI of 1983) the Director-General, Department of Shipping is pleased to make the following orders which shall be known as the Merchant Shipping Minimum Safe Manning Orders, 1990:—

- 1. These Orders shall apply to all trading ships registered in Bangladesh and the provisions of Rule 14 shall also apply to foreign flag merchant ships in Bangladesh waters.
 - 2. In these Orders, except where the context otherwise requires:
 - (i) "Limited trade" means voyages between ports and places located in the Bay of Bengal between Singapore on the South-east and Colombo on the South-West; and such near coastal voyages anywhere else as may be determined by the Director-General for the duration of such engagement.
 - (ii) "Unlimited trade" means voyages any of which could be beyond the limits of limited trade.

Words and expressions used but not defined in these Orders shall have the same meaning as assigned or attributed to them in the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watch-keeping for Seafarers, 1978: Bangladesh Merchant Shipping Ordicance, 1983 and Amendment Ordinance, 1988 and relevant Rules.

- 3. All Bangladesh ships shall be required to carry a minimum Safe Manning Certificate issued by the Director-General.
- 4. The Director-General may authorise or depute a Surveyor of the Department to visit and check any Bangladesh ship for complaince of the provisions of these Rules. A Bangladesh ship which does not have a valid Minimum Safe Manning Certificate or is not manned in accordance with such certificate may not be allowed to proceed to sea.
- 5. The owners may employ officers and rating in excess of what is being shown in the Minimum Safe Manning Certificate so long the concerned ship has approved accommodation and life saving appliances.
- 6. No person who is not for the time being a citizen of Bangladesh shall be employed as seamen or in any other capacity on a Bangladesh ship without the previous permission in writing of the Director-General.
- 7. No person may be employed as Master, Chief Engineer, Chief Officer, Second Engineer or in any capacity with the immediate responsibility for loading, discharging and care in transit of handling of cargo on a Tanker, Chemical tanker or Gas Carrier unless his certificate is duly endorsed for such service.

- 8. Minimum numbers and grade of Deck Officers to be employed on ship will be determined in accordance with Appendix-A. Minimum number and grade of Engineer Officers, will be determined in accordance with Appendix-B.
- 9. No person shall be engaged on a Bangladesh ship in a position or capacity for which a certificate of competency is required unless such person holds an appropriate or higher grade of certificate duly revalidated where so necessary or a Dispensation granted by the Director-General.
- 10. No person shall be permitted to be incharge of a Navigational watch or Engine Room Watch unless he holds a certificate of competency or a dispensation in lieu thereof. Vessels undertaking short voyages not exceeding 72 hours may opt for 2 watch system.
- 11. No person can be employed on a Bangladesh. Ship unless he is medically tested and declared fit by a Medical Officer acceptable to the Director-General.

- 12. No person over the age of 58 can be employed on a Bangladesh flag ship except with special permission of the Director-General.
- 13. Minimum Safe Manning for Passenger ships and other specialised ships shall be determined by the Director-General taking into account number of passengers, duration of voyage, etc.
- 14. The Director-General may authorise or depute a Surveyor of the Department to visit and check any foreign flag ship in Bangladesh ports for compliance of minimum standards set out by the flag state. If such a ship is found distinctly to contravene any provision of the International Convention on Standards of Training, certification and Watch-keeping for Seafarers, 1978 and the Surveyor is satisfied that the situation posses a risk to safety of life or protection of marine environment then he may detain such a ship and inform the flag state authority or their representative accordingly until the deficiencies are corrected.
- 15. Every Bangladesh ship employing more than 20 persons shall employ at least one ex-Marine Academy Cadet (Nautical or Engineering) unless exempted by the Director-General because of non-availability of such cadet.
- 16. Every Bangladesh ship employing more than 30 persons shall employ at least two ex-Marine Academy Cadets (one Nautical and one Engineering) unless exempted by the Director-General because of non-availability of such cadets.
- 17. Every Bangladesh ship employing more than 32 persons on board shall employ at least 2 Ratings with no previous sea-service experience unless exempted by the shipping Master because of non-availability of such Ratings.

- Note: 1. Figures in Column 3 denotes the grade of certification. A three watch system shall be maintained for vessel of 3,000 K W or over. The Chief Engineer Officer should be non watch-keeping officer where possible.
 - 2. (e) denotes endorsement for Chief Engineer's duty.
 - 3. In addition to the officers specified in column 3 above, the ships of 750 KW registered power or more may be required to carry one "Electrical Engineer Officer" with a degree or a diploma.
 - 4. Vessels under UMS (Unmanned Machinery Space) operation may be permitted to have one Chief Engineer and one Watch-keeping Engineer. The Chief Engineer will be required to have such certificate as shown in Column 3 appropriate to Registered power and trading area.
 - 5. A bay-crossing coaster registered under Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1983 and trading within Bangladesh teritorial ways shall be required to have a Chief Engineer Officer with Certificate of Competency "Coastal Engineer".
